Instructions to authors are published in the January issue each year; reprints are available from the editors and the Journals Division. *Infection and Immunity* is published monthly, one volume per year. ICAAC YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARDS Call for Nominations

1992 ICAAC Young Investigator Awards: Eligibility and Nominations

The Young Investigator Awards were established in 1983 for the Interscience Conference on Antimicrobial Agents and Chemotherapy (ICAAC) under the sponsorship of Merck Sharp & Dohme. The awards are made annually to four individuals. The deadline for nominations for awards to be presented at the 1992 ICAAC is 1 April 1992.

Purpose. To recognize and reward young investigators for excellence in research in the broad areas of microbiology and infectious diseases. A monetary award is provided to support attendance at ICAAC and other endeavors enhancing the educational background of the individual.

Eligibility. Pre- and postdoctoral students and fellows in microbiology and infectious disease fellows, including those not more than 36 months post-training, who have performed significant research in North America. Research eligible for evaluation is limited to the study and understanding of microbiology, infectious diseases, or any of the sciences associated with the discovery and application of chemotherapeutic agents.

Nominations. Individuals may be nominated by an active member of ASM, and nominations are invited from all qualified fellows. Nominations shall be accompanied by (i) a nomination form (ii) a

letter of nomination which includes a specific description of the nominee's research, (iii) a current CV, and (iv) at least three supporting letters from appropriate individuals in the field, preferably from more than one institution. Nomination forms can be obtained from ASM Headquarters (see below).

Award process. Awardees will be selected by the award committee on the basis of research potential and quality.

Award. Each young investigator selected will receive a monetary award and a certificate. Four awards will be made each year. Awards will be presented by the President of ASM and the Chair of the ICAAC Committee at the annual ICAAC meeting. Awardees and their mentors will be honored at a private dinner hosted by the sponsor, Merck Sharp & Dohme, and their names will be published in ASM NEWS.

Submission procedure. All materials in support of a nomination for the 1992 award must be assembled and copied before submission. Submit six copies by 1 April 1992 to the Awards Committee, American Academy of Microbiology, 1325 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, DC 20005.

HOECHST- ROUSSEL AWARD Call for Nominations

1992 Hoechst-Roussel Award: Eligibility and Nominations

Nominations for the 1992 Hoechst-Roussel award, under the sponsorship of Hoechst-Roussel Pharmaceuticals, are invited by the Awards Committee and the Interscience Conference on Antimicrobial Agents and Chemotherapy (ICAAC) Committee. Scientists from all parts of the world are eligible to receive the Hoechst-Roussel award.

The deadline for nominations for the award to be presented at the 1992 ICAAC is 1 April 1992.

Purpose. The Hoechst-Roussel Award will be made annually to a person engaged actively in research in antimicrobial chemotherapy. The award is made for the purpose of stimulating research in this field. Appropriate research may be either basic work in developing new agents, investigating antimicrobial action or resistance to antimicrobial agents, or research relating to the pharmacology, toxicology, or clinical use of those agents.

Eligibility. There shall be no age limit or professional requirement for the award. The sole requirement of candidacy shall be outstanding accomplishment in research or development in the areas appropriate to the award.

Award. The Hoechst-Roussel Award consists of a cash award of \$20,000 and a commemorative medal. The recipient and spouse/guest will be reimbursed for travel expenses to the presentation ceremonies at the Interscience Conference on Antimicrobial Agents and Chemotherapy. At this meeting, the

recipient will be expected to present a special lecture on the research for which the award is made. In addition, the awardee and spouse/guest will be invited to Hoechst in Frankfurt and Roussel in Paris to deliver his or her lecture to an audience at these parent companies.

Award process. The recipient of the Hoechst-Roussel Award shall be selected by an Award Committee of five persons.

Nominations. Nominations may be submitted by members of the American Society for Microbiology or the Infectious Diseases Society of America. Nominations must be received by the American Society for Microbiology by 1 April of the year in which the award is to be made. No person shall submit more than one nomination. Nominations shall be accompanied by (i) a nomination cover sheet, (ii) a letter of nomination, which includes a specific description of the research on which the nomination is based (iii) a current CV, (iv) not more than three reprints of work most relevant to nomination, (v) at least five and no more than seven supporting letters, desirable from persons in the field not closely associated with the nominee.

Submission procedures. All materials in support of a nomination for the 1992 award must be assembled and copied before submission. Submit six copies by 1 April 1992 to the Awards Committee, American Academy of Microbiology, 1325 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, DC 20005.
