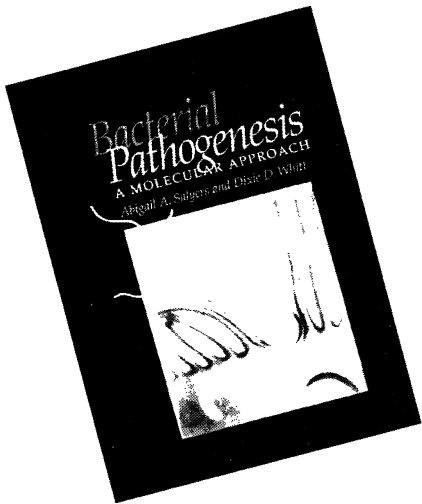

**B**acterial Pathogenesis: A Molecular Approach is the first text designed to provide a comprehensive introduction to this dynamic field for both students and researchers. The application of molecular techniques to the study of bacterium-host interaction has made possible great progress in fundamental understanding of the molecular basis of infectious diseases. In the text the authors integrate material from pathogenic microbiology, molecular biology, immunol-

ogy, and human physiology to provide a complete but accessible overview of the field. The text is engagingly written with more than 150 color diagrams to help students clearly understand the molecular mechanisms of pathogenesis. Boxed highlights are included in all of the chapters and cover material of special clinical and historical interest. Each chapter concludes with a detailed summary, a list of selected readings, and a set of study questions. An extensive glossary is included at the end of the book.

# MOLECULAR PATHOGENESIS OF PERIODONTAL DISEASE

This text and reference title details the molecular basis for pathogenesis of periodontal disease and deals with up-to-date information on microbial virulence factors and host response, including cytokines, neutrophils, and genetic factors, as well as periodontal wound healing. In addition, the molecular and cellular bases of growth and

development and the application of molecular technology to periodontal regeneration are discussed. Particular emphasis is placed on molecular explanations of host/bacterial interactions and wound healing as they occur in chronic infectious diseases as exemplified by periodontal infection.

The volume is an outgrowth of the symposium entitled "The Molecular Basis of Periodontal Pathogenesis" held at the State University of New York at Buffalo in 1993. International scientists contribute over 30 chapters. Students of infectious disease, especially oral microbiologists and immunologists, and those interested in periodontal pathogenesis will find this new volume essential reading.

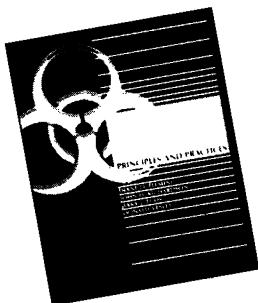

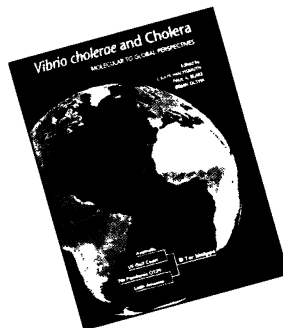

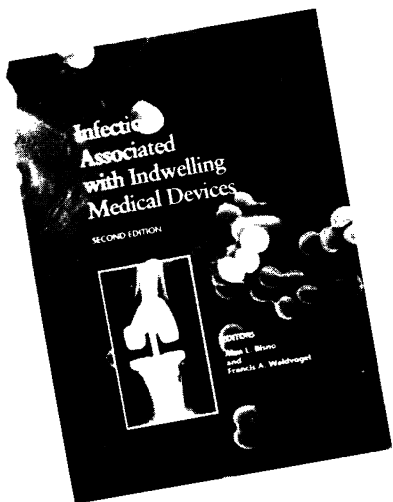

Indwelling prosthetic devices – such as catheters, heart valves, vascular bypass grafts, implanted ocular lenses, central nervous system shunts, artificial hips, and intrauterine devices – have become a common and indispensable part of modern medical care. Infection is the main complication associated with these devices. This volume reviews available information about such infections. There is extensive consideration of the basic science aspects of foreign body infections, including the complex interactions between host, prosthesis, and microorganism. The epidemiological, microbiological, and clinical aspects of the major forms of prosthetic infections are considered in detail. Current concepts of management, including the role of prophylactic antibiotics, are also analyzed. Clinicians, including infectious disease specialists, general surgeons, surgical subspecialists, and physicians in biomedical research studying host–parasite interactions and microbial pathogenesis will find this book timely and useful.

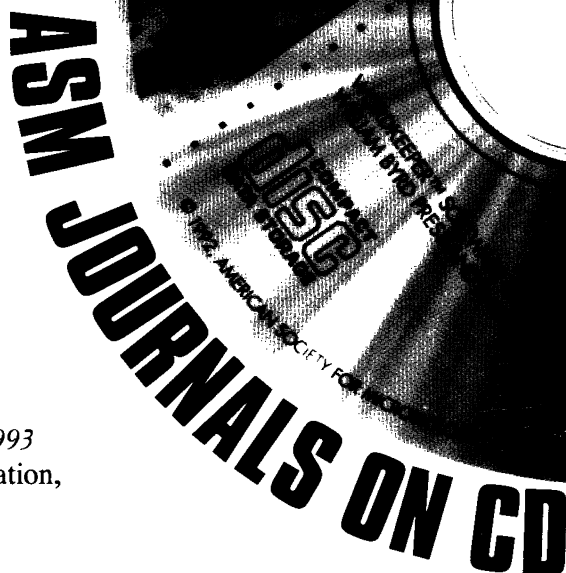
